MINUTES OF MEETING
FEBRUARY 20, 1990

The Board of County Commissioners met this date in regular session

The meeting was called to order by Sheriff Smith and followed with prayer by Commissioners Whitfield.

Willard Smith, representing the Pioneer Settlement Organization met with the Board regarding the purchase of 20 or 30 pine trees now standing in the area that is to be cleared for the Pioneer Settlement in Sam B. Atkins Park. The Board determined that the value of the trees was minimal less than a \$100.00 and since the Pioneer Settlement is a non-profit organization and since the timbers would be used on the property, the Board agreed unanimously by consensus to let the Pioneer Settlement have the trees.

The Board received a bid from Harry J. Horton, House movers, Panama City, Florida for relocating the house for the Pioneer Settlement located at Scotts Ferry, Florida to Sam B. Atkins Park, Blountstown, Fl for \$1,900.00

The Board agreed unanimously to accept the bid from Harry J. Horton for relocating house from Scotts Ferry to Sam B. Atkins Park, Blountstown, Florida for \$1,900.00, moving expenses to be paid from grant funds received by Pioneer Settlement Organization.

Barbara Davis was present at the meeting to ask the Board to honor their agreement to her during budget hearings and to pay annual dues for the Tax Collectors Asso. in the amount of \$2,064.36 from the General Fund.

The Board agreed to honor their commitment and pay her dues for this year only from the general fund.

James M. White made a report on the recycling task force committee meeting. (See attached) "Summary of the Economic Analysis Recycling Options."

Much discussion and questions were posed regarding options 1-4 regarding lease of trucks, recycling bags, lease of mobile trailers and various benefits of options 1-4.

Commissioner Whitfield recommended due to questions posed and differing opinions, to hold a special board meeting, with the City of Blountstown and City of Altha present, later this week or the first of next week in order to further study the options. More closely in order to avoid encumbering the county with any more debts.

The Board recessed until 2 P.M., Friday February 23, 1990 in order for the Board members to attend a ceremony honoring Ray Oglesby for his induction into Agriculture Hall of Fame.
